Athens, Texas, firefighters respond to a tractor trailer truck crash with a driver trapped in the wreckage. Video of the step-by-step process of the removing of the truck's cab, piece by piece, shows how complex big rig rescues can be. In this rollover accident, the driver was held upside down, crushed between the roof and the seat cushion. Rescuers worked with hand tools and hydraulic rescue equipment to complete the body recovery operation.
