<b>A+</b>	PULSE	<b>NEW</b> Burns: Assessment and Treatment	464-0110	30 minute video plus course materials	Burn management has consistently been one of the most controversial topics in all of emergency care. Every year, nearly 1 million people require treatment for burn injuries in the United States. Add to that an increased terrorism threat in the United States, and it can be assumed that there will also be an increase in the number of burn-related injuries. This course is designed to provide the emergency responder with the knowledge needed to effectively and safely assess and manage patients with various burn-related injuries.
<b>A+</b>	Firefighter Training	<b>NEW</b> High-Rise Structure Fires	038-0110	30 minute video plus course materials	A high-rise structure fire is exciting in the movies, but in real life, it can be a greater challenge than anything else a firefighter may face. To successfully combat the high-rise structure fire, fire departments need to know how these buildings are put together, what inherent fire suppression systems are available, how to deploy resources and engage tactics, and how to get occupants out of the building.
<b>A+</b>	Firefighter Training	Special Teams: Introduction to Ice Rescue	038-0306	30 minute video plus course materials	Ice rescue incidents pose special hazards to the responding personnel. If fire personnel are not aware of the potential hazards, they could easily become victims themselves. Understanding the limits and capabilities of responding personnel can result in a successful ice rescue and ensure that the rescuers are not harmed. Part one of a two-part series, this course discusses incident planning, tactical operations, and safety concerns for rescue personnel at an ice-involved incident. Types of ice formations and the characteristics and potential hazards of ice are described. In addition, this course provides an overview of the signs and symptoms of hypothermia and its treatment.
<b>A+</b>	Firefighter Training	Ladder Company Rescue Operations	038-0805	30 minute video plus course materials	FETN visited the busiest ladder company in the United States and learned a few tricks of the trade. This course looks at proper assignments and equipment for a ladder company and discusses tactics used at single family, multiple-occupancy dwellings. The course also covers tactics used at high-rise and commercial buildings
<b>A+</b>	PULSE	EMS and HIPAA	464-0108	30 minute video plus course materials	Every healthcare provider must comply with HIPAA, including emergency medical technicians. Many EMS providers are unsure of what does and does not violate HIPAA. This is complicated by the fact that most calls are conducted in public or semi-public environments, which can make it more difficult to protect a patient's healthcare information than in a hospital. This course answers many questions about HIPAA that EMS providers have, including such issues as how to comply with HIPAA when a citizen rides along with the crew, what health information can be handed over to police at the scene of an accident, and practical strategies for compliance out in the field.
<b>A+</b>	PULSE	The Ins and Outs of Technical Rescue	464-0805	60 minute video plus course materials	Emergency personnel occasionally face rescue situations requiring specific skills that exceed their training. This course explains some of the dangers involved in high-angle, confined-space, and swiftwater rescue situations and discusses the role of non-technician EMS personnel during these rescues. You will see simulations and actual rescues and learn how quickly even a situation that appears simple can turn deadly for the untrained rescue team.

In this course, meteorologist Al Moller from the National Weather Service will teach you about some basic types of storms so you can prepare. We also profile the Virginia Beach, Virginia fire department, and the Manlius, New York, fire department, which were faced with two very different storms recently. Find out how their pre-plans paid off.

The proper and consistent use of PASS devices, along with some applicable outside activities that will help all of us survive, are also included. The tools of the trade are nothing more than the bare essentials that every firefighter should have when operating on the fireground.
A+	Firefighter Training	<b>The Hazards of Fighting Trash Container Fires, Part 1: Overview</b>	038-0031	30 minute video plus course materials	Though not one of the most glorious aspects of firefighting, trash container fires can pose several concerns, both with firefighter safety and fire suppression. Trash containers are an important part of retail and commerce in our country. Retailers, manufacturers, and food service industries all use these containers to store their waste. Containers can also be seen in large residential developments for storage of household waste. Trash containers are easily subjected to vandalism and arson. In addition to this vandalism, people can improperly dispose of hazardous materials and other debris that may react inside of the container. This reaction may be dangerous to firefighters, so proper equipment and tactics are imperative for firefighter safety. This first of two lessons will give firefighters the fundamental knowledge to operate safely at these types of incidents.
