

FIREFIGHTER TRAINING

NEW **A+** **Terrorist Preparedness: Critical Incident Management**

038-0207 / 30 min

This course will illustrate the Montgomery County Incident Management System, explaining how the Montgomery County system supports the National Incident Management System. This example can be adapted and applied in most regions.

A+ **HazMat Awareness, Part 1 of 8**

737-0201 / 30 min

This course is based on curriculum from IFSTA and the University of Kansas Fire Service Training division. It complies with all required dimensions of the OSHA and EPA annual requirement for Hazardous Materials refresher training for Awareness and Operations, as well as the initial Awareness Level training required of every first responder in the nation. The course includes NFPA 472, Professional Competence of Responders to Hazardous Materials Incidents (2002 edition) for Awareness level, and also covers the Office of Domestic Preparedness Emergency Responder Guidelines (for incidents involving WMD) for Awareness Level firefighters and law enforcement officers.

A+ **Vehicle Operations & Scene Safety**

038-7002 / 30 min

This course addresses a range of issues relating to emergency vehicle driver training, safe driving procedures, vehicle safety, and safety at incident scenes on roadways. The course is intended to promote awareness of the issues and an appropriate attitude toward safety.

A+ **Target Hazards: Restaurant Fires**

054-0075 / 60 min

Restaurants are one of the most common occupancies outside of the single-family home. In this edition of American Heat, you'll see how two restaurant fires presented responders with unexpected danger they had never faced before. You'll take a tour of a restaurant to find hidden hazards you've never thought about and

discover the characteristics of restaurant construction that just might save your life.

A+ **Winter Firefighting Operation**

Wind and rain. Snow and sleet. Ice and fog. Fire does not care what the weather forecast is like. How do you prepare for winter firefighting operations? We went to the locations where these kinds of conditions are endured and even taken for granted. Join American Heat and learn why it's not a good idea to wash your fire truck in the middle of January, how a coating of ice can actually keep you warm, and how to use pumper engines as snowplows.

NEW **A+** **American Heat: Incident and Disaster Preparation**

463-0207 / 30 min

This course identifies problems, concerns, issues, and lessons learned from recent hurricane and other disasters and identifies new protocols, preparedness procedures, training methods, and planning that can be utilized by fire departments and response teams facing similar disasters.

A+ **American Heat: GIS: Providing the Foundation for Real-Time Intelligence, Part 1**

463-0206 / 30 min

Imagine having the floor plan of a large bank at the fingertips of law enforcement officers before responding to a robbery; the most direct route for firefighters to a wildfire; or a graphical representation of the most likely terrorist targets within a given geographical radius. GIS (Geographic Information System) technology provides first responders with real-time intelligence data in the form of maps, floor plans, photographs and much more. Join us as we explain the basics of how this new technology works.

A+ **American Heat: Holy Smoke!: Fires in Places of Worship**

463-0205 / 60 min

Fires in places of worship are rare but when they happen, they can be one of the most challenging types of fires that we encounter. Knowing the reasons why fires in these buildings start, their usual locations, building construction features, and key strategies/tactics for fighting these fires can mean the difference between controlling the situation and losing the building and perhaps firefighters.

NEW **PULSE: Pediatric RAD/Asthma**

The prevalence of asthma and associated morbidity has been on the rise for the past 20-30 years. Children are affected disproportionately, and up to 12 percent of children in the United States are affected. This course discusses emergency treatment approaches and differential diagnosis of pediatric asthma.

A+ **PULSE: Care Across Cultures**

The face of our nation has changed dramatically. And in the next 50 years, all major minority groups are estimated to increase in population. To meet the demands of such a diverse culture, first responders must work well with patients and co-workers from different backgrounds. This course increases staff sensitivity to cultural differences and offers guidelines for working within a diverse environment.
