#### Rehabilitation in the Fire Service, Part 1

One of the forgotten sectors in the incident management system is the rehabilitation sector. Often assigned as an afterthought and well into the incident, the rehab sector helps us preserve the health and welfare of our team. In this course, we explore how to set up and manage the rehab sector. In addition, we discuss why we need a rehab sector and why it should be established for small incidents as well as large. We also lay out the medical aspects of rehab and the physiological and psychological needs that rehab addresses.
