Most of these accidents can be prevented through policy enforcement, proper training, vehicle maintenance, and the use of safety devices. This course examines some of the most common causes of apparatus deaths and identifies methods that fire agencies can implement to help reduce firefighter fatalities.

EMS providers are often called upon to aid people in a critical medical emergency. This in turn exposes the EMS provider to repeated exposure to medical emergencies that most of the population will never see or be exposed to in a lifetime. In addition, the EMS provider is exposed to administrative and operational stress. This program will provide the EMS provider, administrators, municipal leaders, and EMS family members with useful information for surviving the EMS profession and identifying the many challenges faced by today's EMS providers.

Approximately 50 commercial bus riders are injured. The vast majority of the time, buses travel without accident, however, when a bus-related accident does occur, local responders may be confronted with a major multi-casualty incident for which they are not prepared. <b>A+</b>	PULSE	<b>PULSE: Child Abuse Identification</b>	464-0307	30 minute video course materials	The identification of child abuse is everyone's responsibility, but first responders have special legal responsibilities when it comes to identifying and reporting suspected abuse. This program equips first responders with information to be able to identify the behavioral and physical signs and symptoms of an abusive situation. It provides information on the EMT's responsibilities as a mandated reporter, and it provides clear guidelines on how to properly report suspected abuse.
<b>A+</b>	American Heat	<b>Wildland Fire Investigation</b>	463-0407	30 minute video course materials	Wildland fire incidents numbered over 70,000 in 2005; over 2.8 million acres were burned nationwide. This does not include weed filled vacant lots, or smaller fires in the urban interface zone. In November of 2006, 5 USFS firefighters were killed defending a home in Riverside County, California. The cause was arson, and the suspect is believed to have ignited over 40 wildland fires. Fire responders who can identify origin and cause, and preserve evidence improve the likelihood of capturing and prosecuting arsonists.
<b>A+</b>	Firefighter Training	<b>Weapons of Mass Destruction: Decontamination</b>	038-0507	30 minute video course materials	This course will illustrate the Montgomery County Decontamination System and how the system will support both field and hospital applications as adopted by Montgomery County and the South Pennsylvania Terrorism Task Force. Their example can be adapted and applied in most regions.

<b>A+</b>	Firefighter Training	<b>Firegounrd: Big Rig Rescue</b>	711-0028	30 minute video course materials	Athens, Texas, firefighters respond to a tractor trailer truck crash with a driver trapped in the wreckage. Video of the step=by-step process of the removing of the truck's cab, piece by piece, shows how complex big rig rescues can be. In this rollover accident, the driver was held upside down, crushed between the roof and the seat cushion. Rescuers worked with hand tools and hydraulic rescue equipment to complete the bod recovery operation.
<b>A+</b>	American Heat	<b>Utility Control</b>	463-0507	30 minute video course materials	The Utility control program contains information about electrical gas, and water emergencies and how to mitigate them. Each of these emergencies is unique, but many of the tactics to be considered by command are quite common. The course topics include stand-alone utility emergencies as well as how utilities affect a structure fire response.
<b>A+</b>	American Heat	<b>American Heat: Special Responses for Special Events</b>	463-0105	60 minute video course materials	Every community in America has special events that draw thousands of people a town. Estimates have more than 25,000 local festivals and gatherings taking place each year in the United States. Each event involves a potential response from local emergency responders. In this course, we take a behind-the-scenes look at the preparation it takes to provide protection for a city during special events. Showcased are fire professionals who coordinate up to three NASCAR races a year.
