It is achieved only through planning, training, and a dedicated public safety and healthcare team. Rescue and EMS crews in Minneapolis, Minnesota, have been widely praised for their response during the I-35 W bridge collapse in 2007. This is their story. As they share it, they hope to convey their successes, trials, and lessons learned from one of the most challenging mass casualty incidents in the state's history.
A+	Firefighter Training	NEW High-Occupancy Structure Fires: Educational Occupancies	038-0410	30 minute video plus course materials	High-occupancy structure fires do not always involve hotels or apartment buildings. Educational facilities also fall into the category of high-occupancy structures. This course gives firefighters some perspective by looking back at two of the worst school fires in U.S. history, as well as how today's schools are—or should be—protected from fire. Also discussed are evacuation techniques, proper fire drills, principles of code standards, and post-incident analysis.

This course covers what to do in this situation and, more importantly, what not to do when delivering the news. We visit Dan McGuire at his seminar as he walks us through a re-enactment of the notification, focusing on the basics of treating the incident with tradition, honor, and respect.

Chances are you have some in your district, and for that reason, you want to watch Part 2 of School Bus Rescue on FETN with vehicle extrication specialist Ron Moore. In this course, Moore goes through basic school bus extrication. A school bus is not just another vehicle. Watch this course so you will know how to react in case of an accident involving a school bus

The emphasis is on the lessons we have learned over the years and the importance of retaining the intuitional memory of a fire department. Joining Chief Ronny J. Coleman for this course is our very special guest, Bill McCrossen, formerly with the New Orleans Fire Department.
A+	PULSE	PULSE: Recreational Drugs	464-0506	30 minute video plus course materials	Despite ongoing efforts, recreational drug use is growing—and changing—with the population. Recreational drug use is anything but child's play, and EMS personnel must be prepared to manage prehospital care of patients affected by recreational drugs. This course explores the most common recreational drugs and their effects as well as how you can care for drug users. This course also looks at the statistics and evaluates the trends driving recreational drug use.
A+	Firefighter Training	The Cove Street Fire and Rescue	463-0606	30 minute video plus course materials	These days, the U.S. firefighter is often pushed to retain knowledge beyond the historical definitions of firefighting. EMS, HazMat, and homeland security issues are just a few examples. As firefighters progress with their certifications and education, sometimes the most vital, basic self-preserving knowledge and practices get misplaced. This course serves to motivate new and experienced firefighters and remind them of the responsibility for their own safety and that of the "team."
A+	Firefighter Training	The Blackstock Fire	463-0706	30 minute video plus course materials	This course identifies how a firefighting team should stay in contact with one another and discusses how to determine risk versus benefit while at a fire. An explanation of accountability and insider information on how to recognize a fire that is behaving inconsistent with a normal fire also are given.

A+	PULSE	PULSE: Extremity Injuries	464-1006	30 minute video plus course materials	Regardless of cause or mechanism of injury, with a few exceptions, extremity injuries are treated similarly. Scene size-up, patient evaluation, treatment decision, immobilization, and pain control are all part of the basic and advanced EMS practicum. There are decisions to be made, however, in situations where "life over limb" cases present. Also, in patients with compartmental syndrome, severe crush injuries, amputations, neurovascular compromises, and other presentations, decisions as to treatment and hospital transport (i.e., ground vs. air) all play a significant role in patient outcome.
A+	Firefighter Training	The Art of Smoke Reading	463-1106	30 minute video plus course materials	Regardless of the size of your fire department, each and every firefighter should be concerned with the art of smoke reading. Smoke reading will better prepare the firefighter to detect unsafe smoke/fire conditions in buildings and will provide critical information in the fire suppression decision-making process. This is just one of the many tools that should be contained in the "tool box" for firefighters. This course will define smoke, its toxic hazards, chemical makeup, and behavior. We review the various smoke control/management systems affecting smoke reading and list the fundamental safety precautions in reading smoke conditions.
A+	Firefighter Training	Leadership Lessons From the Marine Corps	038-0506	30 minute video plus course materials	The U.S. Marine Corps is an organized, trained, and equipped team of people who operate, overcome, and win in chaotic and dangerous conditions. Deep in the heart of each Marine is the confidence to overcome any adversary and the desire to be in the first wave ashore. Likewise, the fire service is composed of people who willingly respond to crisis and danger in their communities to help citizens in need and eliminate the dangerous conditions that threaten. This course is based upon more than 10 years of hands-on seminars titled "Where the Battle Begins" that have asked firefighters of all ages and ranks to apply Marine Corps leadership principles and approaches to their everyday challenges in their fire departments. While the Marine Corps and fire service use very different weapons and are chartered differently, most participants in the seminars found significant congruence in the nature of the people in the two organizations and, by extension, in the leadership principles they apply.
