But for a significant number of women, pregnancy presents an additional challenge when it is complicated by serious problems. This course examines some of the most common pregnancy complications EMS providers are likely to encounter in the field, including diabetes mellitus, pre-eclampsia, hypertension, trauma during pregnancy, and preterm labor.

Firefighter Rescue: Drags, Carries, and Lifts, Part 1	735-0117	30 minute video plus course materials	Over the past several years, a number of firefighter rescue attempts have been delayed or, quite possibly, failed due to the inability to lift, drag, and/or remove the downed member. These critical events and the subsequent investigative reports support the need for a specific training program that focuses on quick, safe, and effective techniques to drag, lift, and/or remove a firefighter from a hazardous environment. In this two-part series, we detail a number of basic and advanced firefighter drags and carries to assist rescue crews in the rapid removal of a lost, trapped, or disoriented firefighter.

And they are the most under-appreciated. You are in one every week, but when is the last time you thought to yourself, "How would I handle a fire here?" In this course, you will see how two restaurant fires presented responders with unexpected danger they had never faced before. You will take a tour of a restaurant to find hidden hazards you have never thought about. You will discover the characteristics of restaurant construction that just might save your life – or take it. But above all, this course will open your eyes to the worst type of threat firefighters face – the common one.
<b>A+</b>	Firefighter Training	<b>A.I.R. – Aviation Incident Response/Crash Rescue Management</b>	463-0503	60 minute video plus course materials	In this course, we highlight two departments who discovered the realities of crash rescue management (CRM). Exactly one month after September 11, 2001, New York City was hit with another aircraft tragedy. A passenger jet crashed into a Queens neighborhood, destroying homes and taking lives. This course presents firsthand accounts from FDNY firefighters about the operational and emotional challenges they faced throughout this incident. We also visit the Charlotte (NC) Fire Department and learn from their experience in responding to the plane crash incident at the Charlotte-Douglas Airport on January 7, 2003.

It is estimated there are more than 25,000 local festivals and gatherings each year in the United States. Each event involves a potential response from local emergency responders. In this course, we take a behind-the-scenes look at the preparation it takes to provide protection for a city during special events. We speak with fire professionals who coordinate three NASCAR races a year and examine the dangers presented by the events.
<b>A+</b>	PULSE	<b>Spinal Injuries—An Unstable Situation</b>	464-0105	60 minute video plus course materials	It is estimated that there will be more than 11,000 new spinal cord injuries this year alone. As a first responder, you may play an important role in not only these patients' survival but also in their chances for any kind of recovery. Anatomy and physiology, proper assessment and treatment, mechanism of injury, and immobilization techniques are all factors in the outcomes of these calls, so you should know them well. We cover these topics and more in this course.
