**P** **Swiftwater Safety and Rescue:  
A Matter of Survival**

An average of 200 Americans drown each year in flash flooding. It is the top weather-related killer, ahead of earthquakes, tornadoes, and hurricanes. This course includes basic safety and survival skills to be implemented in and around the moving water environment. It also covers basic rescue skills, including self-rescue skills, shore-based rescues, management of aquatic spinal injuries, rescue from low-head dams, and boat-based rescues.

**P** **Class A Foam and Compressed Air Foam**

Learning how and why certain equipment and products work is very important. **P** **HazMat Awareness, Part 5 of 8: Basics of Material  
Safety Data Sheets and Hazardous Materials**

This course provides basic information about material safety data sheets (MSDS) and shipping papers that indicate hazardous materials and highlights possible criminal or terrorist activities involving chemical and biological agents. In addition, limitations of using the senses in determining the presence or absence of hazardous materials are given, and first responders are shown how to identify the hazardous material(s) in each situation by name, UN/NA identification number, or placard.

This is the first part of our rescue technician series. This introductory course will help firefighters and fire officers develop a respect for the dangers of a confined space

emergency. A review of the laws, rules, regulations, and standards that apply to confined space rescue will provide a foundation for response to these emergencies.

**P** **Geriatric Patient Down**

464-0607 / 30 min

Approximately 25 percent of Americans will be 65 years of age or older by the year 2030 and will represent 70 percent of all ambulance transports. The geriatric patient is at a high risk of falling, which makes this one of the most common calls EMTs will face, especially in locations with a large geriatric population. This course discusses why older

adults are at increased risk of falls, common MOIs, and emergency treatment modalities for older adults.

**P** **PULSE: Getting the Most Out of Patient Assessment**

464-0606 / 30 min

It is vitally important that EMS providers conduct a thorough patient assessment on each and every call. This helps ensure that the patient receives a high-quality and seamless level of care from the pre-hospital environment all the way to definitive in-hospital care. This course focuses on the many different aspects of patient assessment, including scene safety, initial impressions, primary/secondary surveys, and focused/detailed physical exams.

**P** **PULSE: Gynecology for EMS**

464-0605 / 60 min

This course focuses on issues specific to females. Like all forms of trauma, traumatic gynecological emergencies and sexual assault are not limited to age. Nontraumatic gynecological emergencies most commonly occur during the childbearing years (12 to 45 years of age), but they are not limited to this age group. Regardless of the cause of the injury or complication, EMS professionals must have a working knowledge of gynecological emergencies to properly care for their patients.
