Exactly one month after September 11, 2001, New York City was hit with another aircraft tragedy. A passenger jet crashed into a Queens neighborhood, destroying homes and taking lives. This course presents first-hand accounts from FDNY firefighters about the operational and emotional challenges they faced throughout this incident. We also visit the Charlotte (NC) Fire Department and learn from their experience in responding to the plane crash incident at the Charlotte-Douglas Airport on January 7, 2003.
A+	Firefighter Training	Fires That Changed the Fire Service: High-Rise Hotel Fires	463-0703	60 minute video plus course materials	In 1946, America experienced its deadliest hotel fire at the Winecoff Hotel in Atlanta with the loss of 119 people. In the '70s and '80s, a string of deadly hotel fires marked a high point for fatalities in hotel tragedies. Two of those fires, the MGM Grand fire in Las Vegas and the DuPont Plaza fire in San Juan, Puerto Rico, became the catalysts to the enactment of the Hotel and Motel Fire Safety Act of 1990. In this course, we revisit four high-rise hotel incidents and reveal the impact these tragedies had on the fire service and public safety.
