  In order to perform firefighting duties safely and effectively, firefighters must maintain peak physical conditioning. This course covers the basics of a physical conditioning program that will keep firefighters in top shape.

This course will orient the EMS provider with problems that may be encountered with the neonate and how to systematically approach resuscitation from all levels.
