The stages of shock are more fully described in relation to signs, symptoms, and treatment. A brief summary of the types of shock with variation in treatment is also included.

But when a controlled burn exercise becomes more dangerous than an actual fire emergency, the realism can have devastating results. When Boulder, Colo., lost two firefighters in a live burn exercise in an abandoned structure in 1982, NFPA took action and developed the Standard on Live Fire Training Evolutions in Structures. Sadly, training deaths are still occurring and individuals are being held accountable in courtrooms. Every incident covered in the program demonstrates why every department should conduct live-burn trainings in accordance with NFPA Standards.

One of his notable achievements is the extinguishment of 117 oil wells set on fire by the retreating Iraqi army during the 1991 Gulf War. Red and his company set the standard for extinguishing oil well fires. This course looks at the life of Red Adair and present leadership lessons learned from this fire service leader
