Altered mental status (AMS) is one of the most challenging dispatches EMS can receive. It is essential for providers to systematically narrow their field diagnosis with the clinical assessment information available to them. To effectively manage altered mental status in the field the following key components should be addressed:

- Systematic, thorough field assessment utilizing all available assessment tools
- Elimination of unlikely causes
- Focus on high risk possibilities until they can be eliminated
- Direct and concise reporting to receiving facility
