Topics include pre-incident planning, the use of pre-dive checklists and dive site diagrams, potential hazard identification, and recognizing dive-related medical emergencies.

We meet Dwight Williams, one of the most successful industrial firefighters in the world. Plus, we catch fire brigades in action at an industrial fire training school in Beaumont, Texas.

In this course, he takes us to the cargo facilities of Airborne Express and Federal Express to look at loading and entering a cargo plane and the hazards that may be found there.
A+	American Heat	American Heat: Detox: Lessons Learned From 9/11	463-0907	30 minute video plus course materials	The North American fire service is in crisis. The level of exposure to workers in the emergency services area is at an all-time high. Pulmonary fibrosis, chronic fatigue, cognitive deficits, short-term memory loss, acid reflux, vocal changes, muscle and joint pain, and an inability to sleep are common physical and mental complaints expressed by rescue workers. One way to combat these problems is through detoxification as part of a total wellness program. This course demonstrates how the detoxification process works and provides firefighters with tips for maintaining optimum health.

This course explores the factors behind this issue: the definition of a mayday situation, reasons firefighters may delay or fail to make the call, and mayday decision-making parameters and calling procedures. FETN also visits TrainingDivision.com in Texas and the 2005 Firehouse Expo in Baltimore, where students drill mayday through a series of obstacles and live fire drills.
A+	PULSE	PULSE: Traumatic Brain Injury	464-0907	30 minute video plus course materials	The majority of brain injuries result from auto accidents, sports injuries, falls, and physical assaults. Since emergency personnel are first responders to people with head injuries, EMS personnel need to be able to properly recognize and assess the signs of a traumatic brain injury. Early recognition and treatment of an extreme brain injury could reduce immediate trauma and future complications. In order to adequately understand traumatic head injury, we review normal anatomy and physiology of the nervous system. We look at common brain injury findings after a traumatic event in order to identify basic life support assessment and treatment modalities. EMS personnel also learn how to recognize what it means for the victim to cope with a traumatic brain injury.
A+	PULSE	PULSE: Altered Mental Status	464-0906	30 minute video plus course materials	Altered mental status (AMS) is one of the most challenging dispatches EMS can receive. It is essential for providers to systematically narrow their field diagnosis with the clinical assessment information available to them. To effectively manage altered mental status in the field, the following key components should be addressed: systematic, thorough field assessment utilizing all available assessment tools, elimination of unlikely causes, focus on high risk possibilities until they can be eliminated, and direct and concise reporting to receiving facility.
