Roughly 6,900 U.S. fire departments serving an estimated 20.3 million people are in communities where no one conducts fire-code inspections. Is this because the fire service has not realized that codes and standards will pay great dividends in saving life and property and significantly improve firefighter safety? This topic is important not only to those departments who plan to implement the use of codes and standards but also for those individuals who want to understand the principles of codes and standards.

Being fully trained on how to take protective actions, wear the proper protective clothing, recognize protective product labels, and know the six steps to take after a hazardous material has been detected are not only needed but also required.



Fire Behavior, Part 2

Understanding how a fire reacts to fuels, oxygen (or the lack thereof), and firefighting tactics can assist firefighters to quickly extinguish fires. This knowledge can result in increased effectiveness and safety. Why did the fire act so differently in this structure than the other one? Why did the last structure fire produce so much smoke? Why wouldn't that last fire go out? Why were we forced to the

floor when we opened our nozzle? Chris DeWolf (Dover, NH) gets into the basics in this episode on fire behavior. Basic principles and concepts of chemistry are applied, further demonstrating why fire behaves the way it does.

School Bus Rescue, Part 4

Part four of our School Bus Rescue series prepares you for some of the most difficult and challenging school bus rescue evolutions. When the tasks introduced in this course have to be accomplished at a real-world incident, responders will find themselves deeply involved in a very demanding and complex technical rescue. American Heat: Holiday Fire Prevention

Studies show that fire-related injuries and deaths increase around the holidays. This course highlights the dangers of fires around the holidays. It also provides firefighters with educational material they can share with the public about fire prevention, especially related to candles, Christmas trees, fireplaces, and other flammable sources common at this time of the year.

In addition, five high-risk issues aimed at assessing risk are identified, and lessons learned from live burn training are explored.

PULSE



PULSE: AHA Guidelines for CPR and Emergency Care

This course highlights changes from the American Heart Association in regard to how rescue workers administer CPR. This course also includes a demonstration of how to provide treatment for a patient in cardiac distress using the new guidelines.



PULSE: A New Day: EMS Controversies and Issues

This course explores emerging issues and controversies confronting emergency medical services (EMS). Many things taken for granted in EMS are given serious scrutiny, such as trauma care (helicopters, golden hour), pain management, lead federal EMS agency, and the ultimate question: Is there really a paramedic shortage?
